Why spay/neuter your pet?

If you're not going to be breeding your pet, the health benefits of spaying or neutering your pet are immense.

As a preventative to reduce risk of infections, cancer, and other abnormalities, that could negatively affect the health of your pet. Reduce the stray pet population. Far more puppies and kittens are born than have homes.

Why does my pet itch?

There are three main causes of itching in your pet

1 External parasites such as fleas/ticks, mites, lice etc. Keeping your pet on a flea/tick regiment can help mostly solve this problem. 2 Environmental allegies - allergens pollen, grass, dander etc. can

cause your pet to become itchy.

3 Food sensitivities, just like us your pet may be allegic to something they're eating.

1 cup pumpkin puree 1 ripe banana, mashed

2 cups oat flour

¼ cup oats

1 eqq

Preheat oven to 350

Mix pumpkin, banana, egg in large bowl Gradually add flour and oats. Mix until dough forms.

Roll out dough and cut into shapes with cookie cutters

Place on parchment lined baking sheet Bake 20–25 minutes Cool completely!
