Consult your vet and relevant authorities to ensure compliance.

To avoid delays, contact your vet at least two weeks in advance.

Car Travel

For road trips, keep your pet secure in a carrier or harness to reduce distractions and ensure comfort. Plan for breaks to allow your pet to stretch, relieve stress, and stay relaxed. Make sure tags are up to date, and get them microchipped in case they get out and lost on the road! Preparation is Key! Schedule a veterinary checkup well in advance to assess your pet's travel readiness and gather necessary documentation. Planning ahead can help reduce stress and ensure a safe, enjoyable trip for you and your pet.
