<u>Ask the Vet</u>

Question : Why is dental care so important for my pet?

1. Preventing Dental Disease

Dental cleanings remove plaque and tartar, which can lead to gingivitis and periodontal disease.

Untreated dental disease can cause pain, tooth loss, and serious infections.

2. Avoiding Systemic Health Issues

Bacteria from oral infections can enter the bloodstream, potentially affecting vital organs like the heart, liver, and kidneys.

3. Reducing Pain and Discomfort

Pets with dental problems may suffer silently. Regular cleanings prevent painful conditions like tooth fractures or abscesses.
Improving Quality of Life

Clean teeth make it easier for pets to eat, chew, and play.

Pets with healthy mouths are often happier and more active.

5. Preventing Bad Breath

Dental cleanings help eliminate halitosis caused by plaque, tartar, or oral infections.
6. Early Detection of Problems

• During a cleaning, radiographs and a full comprehensive oral exam is performed to observe

early signs of issues like oral tumors, infections, or broken teeth, allowing for timely treatment. *Hee hee* 7. Long-Term Cost Savings

 Preventative dental care can reduce the need for more expensive treatments later, like extractions or surgery.

Regular dental cleanings, combined with at-home care like brushing and dental treats, are vital for keeping your pet healthy and happy.

Using a medium cookie scoop (or 2 tablespoonfuls), drop mounds of the mixture onto the prepared baking sheets. Place in the freezer until completely frozen, about 1 hour. Transfer the treats to a freezer-safe container or zip-top bag and store in the freezer for up to 2
